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Critical Genre Analysis as interdiscursive performance in public space

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ABSTRACT

Discourses in professional and public space share an important characteristic in that they interdiscursively appropriate rhetorical and other semiotic resources and conventions across genres, practices and cultures, displaying interesting patterns of interdiscursivity (Bhatia, 2010) especially the way they manage socio-pragmatic space. There has been considerable research effort invested in the analysis of professional discourses of various kind, but relatively little research is available on the analysis of discourse in public contexts. Drawing on the analysis of media discourse in public space, I would like to discuss Critical Genre Analysis as an important framework (Bhatia, 2004, 2012, 2017) to investigate and account for interdiscursive performance in media contexts.

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
